Thoughts from the Chaplain



Some of you were aware I took some to go on a mission trip to Nepal, it is situated between China and India and is where Mount Everest is located. I told a few people I was going to go and appreciate the prayers. I have had a few questions about the trip. I wanted to describe what happened and provide some numbers.

Myself and three other guys from my church drove to Atlanta where we met four more people from other churches, three men and one woman. We all took a 14-hour flight to Doha, Qatar, then another 4-hour flight to Kathmandu, Nepal. We stayed in a hotel in Kathmandu near the church where the work

was centered.

Another pastor and I taught a class on the first day and a half to over 30 Nepali pastors on Homiletics, and how to prepare a sermon. Churches are growing in membership exponentially and they have little access to Christian education and preparation resources. They were all so receptive and very enthusiastic.

The last two days we drove around to several locations and spoke to small groups of Nepalis and gave them all water filters. Most groups were in the city or outlying villages. On the third day, we drove 2 hours south into the country and walked up to some folks living in the Himalayan mountains. That day we also visited a government school on top of a mountain that we would consider an orphanage. We gave the children clothing and toiletries we brought with us. That culture still uses the caste system, and these children were the poorest of the poor.

Many people, especially children, die every year from drinking bad water. Our group provided and gave away 260 water filters that we attached to buckets that we got in the country. These water filters clean bacteria and particulates from dirty water. They last for up to 10 years and 1 million gallons of water. The local pastors arranged for several groups of people to gather at their churches or in different homes to receive the buckets and filters for free.

There is a very large Buddhist Monastery in Kathmandu with many Stupas and Buddhist Temples. The population of Nepal is 2.5 million with 81% being Hindu. Buddhist account for 9%, Islam around 5%, and Kirat 3%. Less the 2% of the people in Nepal claim to be Christian.

God is doing great work in Nepal and in recent months the Christian statistic has changed. As of September, the total is up to 5% of the population declaring the name of Christ. A pastor told us that a Hindu Priest had written an article for the newspaper. He stated if things keep going as they are now, within 20 years Nepal will become a Christian nation.

It is illegal to proselytize for Christ in Nepal and we were on a tourist Visa. On the last day, we shopped and went to the Monkey Temple, a huge Buddhist Stupa. I was blessed to have gone and will go again.

We counted 125 Nepali people who converted to Christianity, their lives changed forever even though it may cost them their families and friends. We do not see this in the states since we have all heard the gospel many times and our faith costs us nothing. If you are really interested, I am willing to tell you more.


Now, if you have been a member of the legion and your cap has become old and not presentable, we will make the same 50% deal with
