

Thoughts from the Chaplain



Christmas is celebrated by people all around the world, whether they are Christians or not. It's a time when family and friends come together and remember the good things they have. People, and especially children, also like Christmas as it's a time when you give and receive gifts.

Why is it called Christmas - The name 'Christmas' comes from the Mass of Christ (or Jesus). A Mass service (which is sometimes called Communion or Eucharist) is where Christians remember that Jesus died for us and then came back to life. The 'Christ-Mass' was shortened to Christmas.

Why December 25th - No one knows the real birthday of Jesus! No date is given in the Bible, so why do we celebrate it on the 25th of December? The early Christians wanted to compete with the pagan holidays celebrated on the winter solstice, December 22, the shortest day of the year.

Why do we put up Christmas Trees - Evergreen trees and other evergreen plants, like Holly, Ivy and Mistletoe have been used for thousands of years to decorate and brighten up buildings during the long dark winter. The evergreen came to represent the eternal life of a believer, that they will never die.

Christmas Bells - Bells, especially Church Bells, have traditionally been associated with Christmas for a long time. In the Anglican and Catholic churches, the church day starts at sunset. In churches that have a Bell or Bells, they are often rung to signal the start of this service.

Why do we hang Christmas lights – Jesus Christ is in the bible and is called the light of the world. The believer's vision is greater along the paths of life by the light of Christ. Before the invention of electricity, candles were used and still represent the season.

Why Candy Canes - The 'J' shape is representative of a shepherd's staff as Jesus is the good shepherd. Also, the 'J' stands for Jesus. The white of the cane represents the purity of Jesus Christ and the red stripes are for the blood he shed when he died on the cross. The peppermint flavor can represent the hyssop plant that was used for purifying in the Bible.

Why we give gifts – To believers, Jesus is a free gift from God and only needs to be accepted. In some traditions, they believe we give each other gifts because the baby Jesus was given gifts by the wise men.

Christmas is the annual festival commemorating the birth of Jesus Christ as a religious and cultural celebration among billions of people around the world. To Christians knowing Christ and accepting His forgiveness for their sins is the greatest thing to happen in their lives and allows them to have peace with God and enter heaven. This December 7 we remember the world-changing event known as Pearl Harbor Day, or as President Franklin D. Roosevelt said in his December 8, 1941, speech declaring war on Japan, "a date which will live in infamy".

Early on Wednesday morning, December 7, 2022, many will gather at Pearl Harbor National Memorial for the 81st Commemoration. The early start marks the moment to the minute 81 years ago when Japanese warplanes descended on Oahu, killing 2,403 service members and civilians, injuring thousands more, and dealing a near-fatal blow to the Navy's fleet at Pearl Harbor.

The mostly young Americans who died that day, along with those who served in uniform during World War II or on the home front war effort are collectively known as the Greatest Generation. Their sacrifices reflect the theme of this year's Commemoration: Everlasting Legacy.

The focus is the importance of remembering Pearl Harbor and how the Greatest Generation saved us from tyranny and brought us peace through reconciliation.

THE LEGION CAP

The only official part of the American Legion Uniform is the Legion Cap. There are several styles in Men's and Women's sizes. They can be found in the American Legion, Flag, and Emblem Store.

A new initiative for members to purchase a cap is that if you attend three meetings within six months, then Post 9 will reimburse you 50% of the purchase. That could be up to a \$35.00 savings with the submission of your receipt. This offer does not include District Caps.


