

Thoughts from the Month

The Right Attitude in Prayer

Because God knows best, our goal in prayer should be to align our heart with His. Isaiah 57:15

Prayer is a crucial discipline for believers' spiritual growth. In fact, it's difficult to mature in Christ without it, because prayer is how we communicate with God and thereby develop a relationship with Him. Furthermore, praying is an act of spiritual worship that brings Him honor.

When we pray to our heavenly Father, we're acknowledging Him as "the high and exalted One who lives forever, whose name is Holy" (<u>Isaiah 57:15</u>). He alone deserves glory, and we ascribe honor to Him when we "pray without ceasing" (<u>1 Thessalonians 5:17</u>) Think of this as maintaining a God-ward attitude throughout the day while seeking His wise governance over every detail of our life.

When we approach God, our motives and the condition of our hearts are important. The Lord dwells both in "a high and holy place, and also with the contrite and lowly of spirit" (Isaiah 57:15). Approaching prayer as a means to get our way doesn't honor God, nor does it produce petitions that He will answer. Instead, come to the Lord in prayer with a humble, repentant attitude of worship.

Be The One Initiative

Hi. This is your Public Relations Chairman/QPR Suicide Prevention Instructor/Webmaster/Jr Vice Commander Mike Williams. Yes, I wear a lot of hats here, but they all kind of work in unison. I just wanted to let

everyone know that The American Legion Post 9 is holding a suicide prevention workshop on the first Wednesday of every month at our post. The workshop begins at 5:00 pm and lasts about an hour and a half. Due to the generous sponsorship of one of our comrades from this post, the workshop is open to the public and is being provided free of charge. This new workshop is our post's response to the "Be The One" initiative from National American Legion. Be The One has a focus on reducing veteran suicide and destigmatizing mental health therapy. The links below will take you to three articles that have been written about our efforts in this post alone. Two are in the Brunswick Newspaper, and one is on National American Legion's website. The response to this program has been overwhelming in such a positive way that I spoke at the district meeting in Baxly about possible district-wide participation in the program. We have a lot of momentum on this, and I plan to keep that momentum as long as I can.
